

Mental Health - The stats

- 71% who self isolated said their Mental Health suffered
- 20% students who had used school counselling rated it 1/10
- 86% said more mental health education should be on curriculum
- 84% said exam uncertainty had strained their mental health
- 54% would not be comfortable accessing school counselling

1,000 responses in 24hours







Mental Health - The Recommendations

- Decisions are communicated in an appropriate & timely manner
- Quick, effective decision making from the NI Exec 'last to know'
- Young people must be consulted and <u>feel</u> consulted
- BEd and PGCE programmes must include modules on Mental Health
- Framework for counselling designed with students for schools
- At least double the counselling provided to schools
