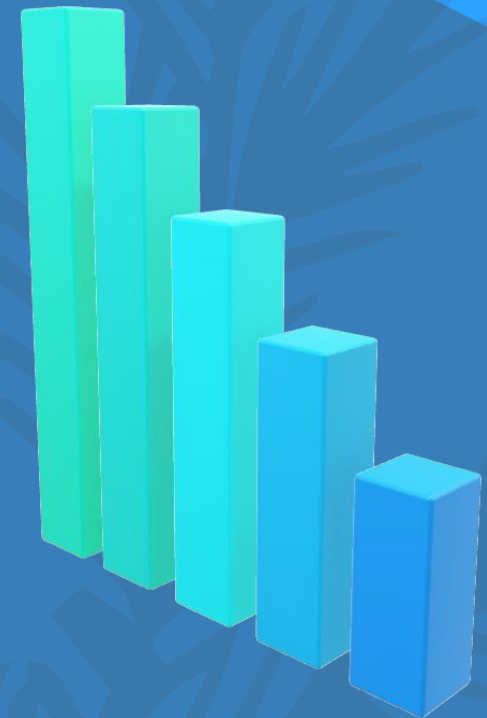
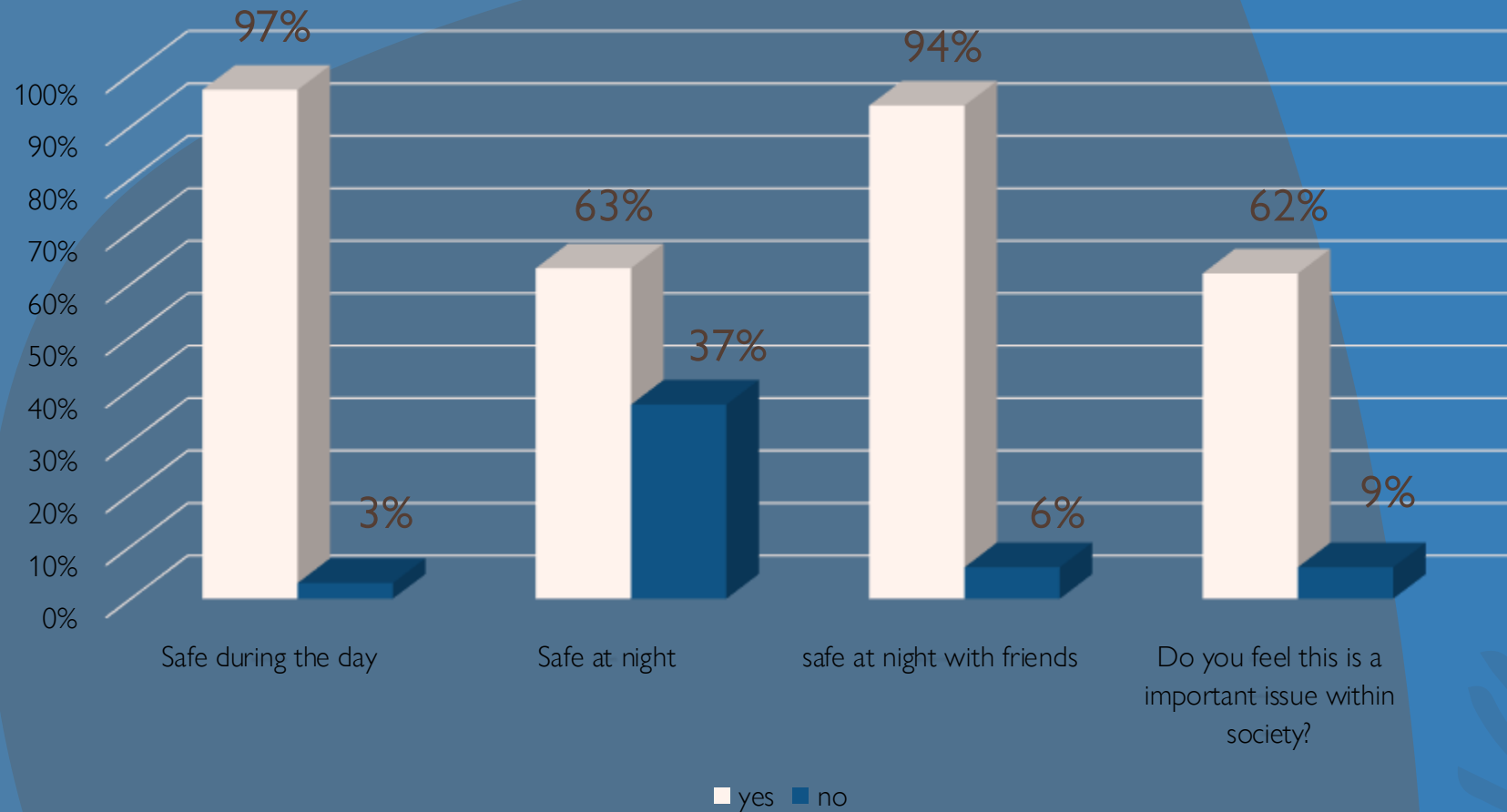

surveyed aged 13-17

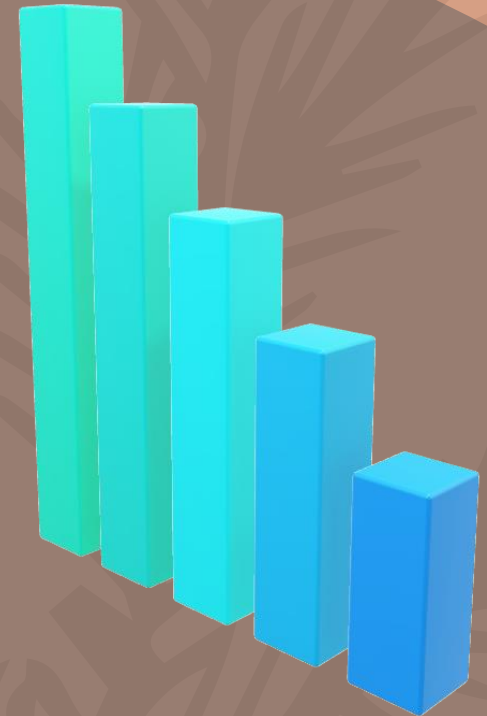
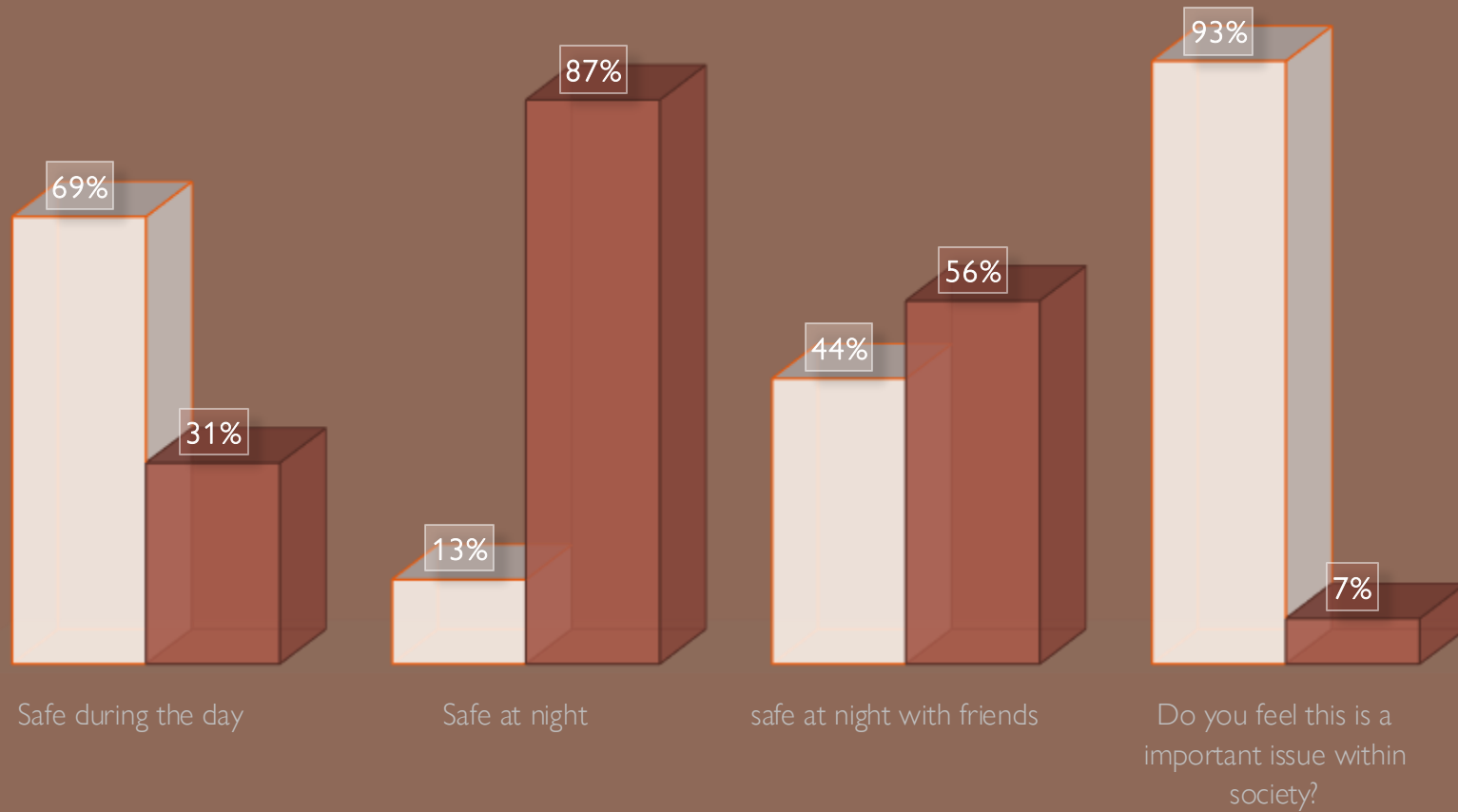

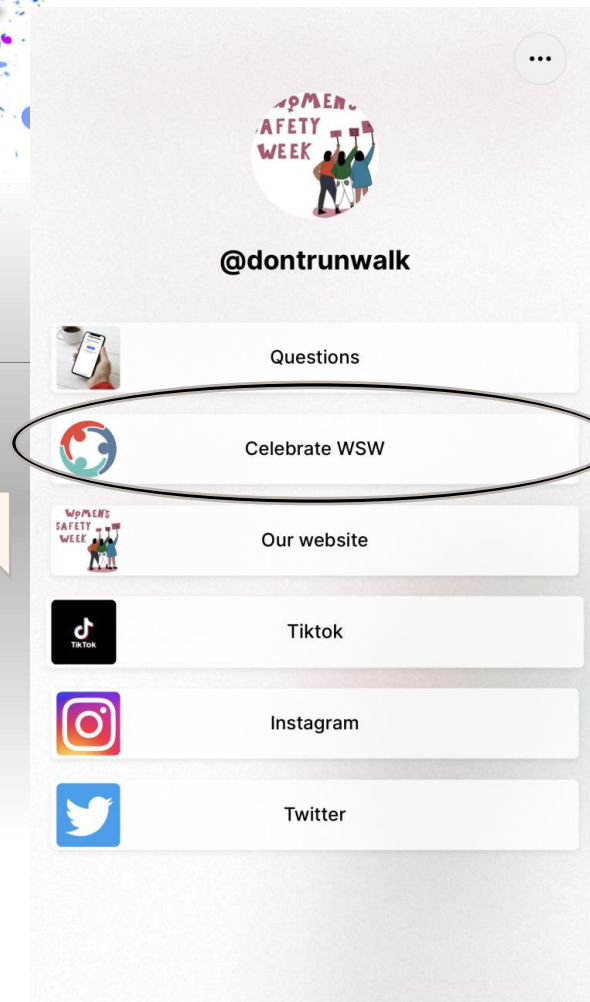

Women's Safety Week 2023

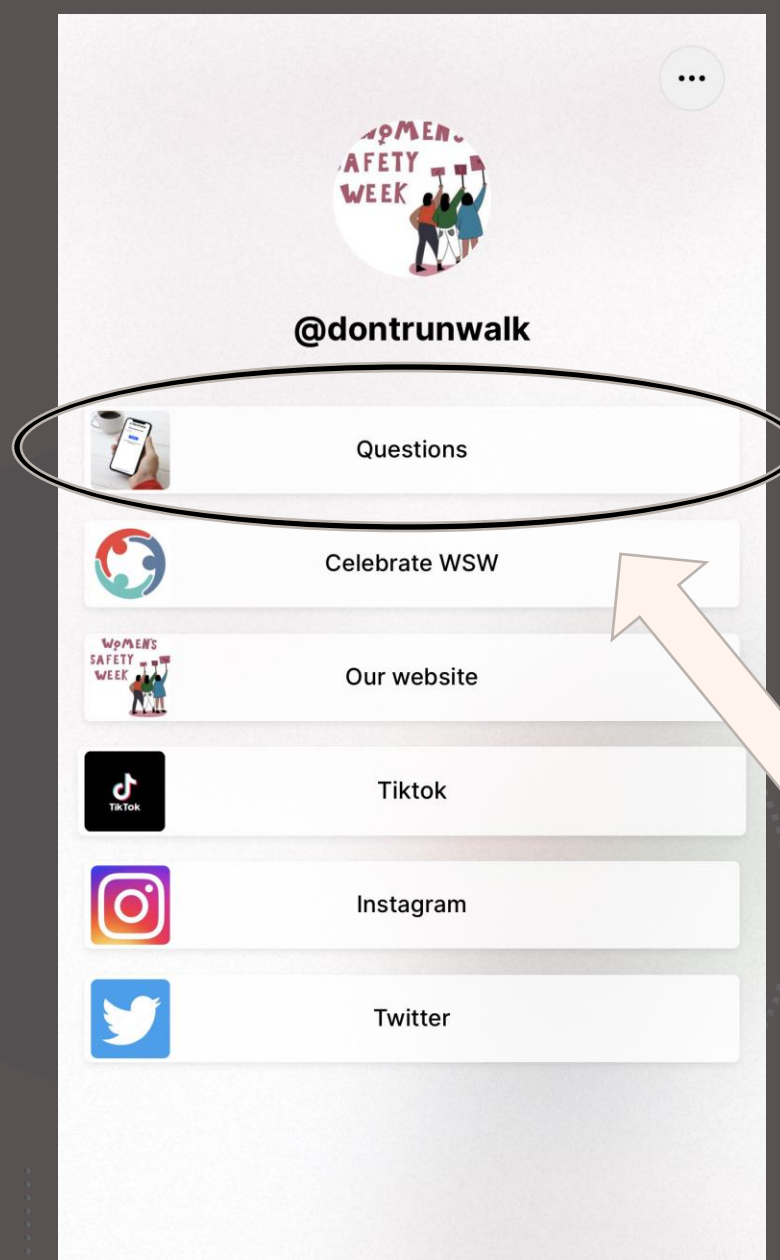
Women's safety week will take place on the 4th to the 8th of December 2023

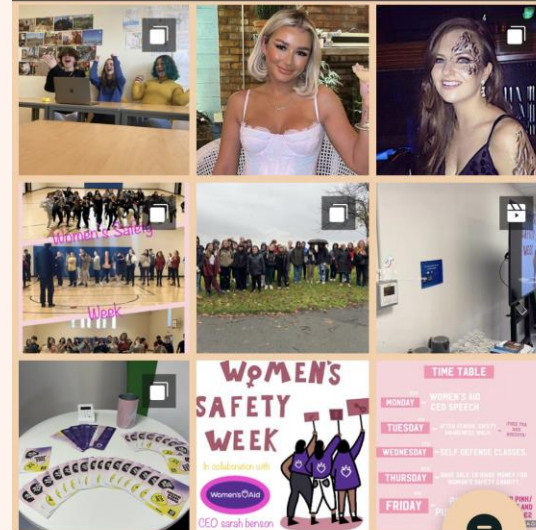
