Suggested Framework To The Working Sessions

- First Working Session (Think)
- Draw/Map/Write
- Can we explain what this goal means?
- What is a world where this goal has been achieved look, feel,
- behave like?
- What does this goal mean to you?
- What does it mean for Peterborough?
- What does it mean for the UK?
- How will we know when the goal is achieved?

Suggested Framework To The Working Sessions

Second Working Session (Process)

Research/Decide/Create

- Who are the companies, charities, NGO's and community leaders working towards your goal?
- Can we map out where the challenges are for individuals, communities, countries?
- Can we create actions we can do as an individuals, communities, countries? Can we find interesting statistics to show individuals, communities, countries? Can we communicate these statistics/actions/needs as infographics? Can we we identify individuals with the skills to help? What do their profiles look like? Where are they? Where will they be in 2030? Plan a creative event that brings people together to focus on solving your goal for individuals, communities, countries.

Suggested Framework To The Working Sessions

Final Working Session (Act)

- *Research/Decide/Create*
- Write a letter of action urging MP's to support your goal
- Write a letter of action to World Leaders, Celebrities, Professional
- Communities to take action towards your goal
- Write a script for a video to encourage young people to act on your goal.
- Create a list of Tweets and updates to encourage individuals, communities, countriesacross the year.
- Create a pledge/petition to focus people on actions to support to your goal. Create a comic that explains your goal in a children friendly way.

Student Roles

We are all working together.

The students have chosen roles and goals, these are designed to support you as well as the students. The roles, global goals and ideas can overlap so you can direct students to distribute tasks evenly. If at any point you need support in managing this please let any member of staff know.



Student Roles

You can rely on your **Ambassador** to ask other groups about their progress, research and share your ideas.

You can rely on your **Scretary General** to keep time, manage resources and delegation of tasks.

You can rely on your **Archivist** to keep records of your progress, notes on future idea strands and past discussions.

You can rely on your **Researcher** to find facts, statistics and points to support your progress.

You can rely on your **Lead Designer** to turn progress into posters, turning discussions into designs and collating everything into creations.

- Share stories of your experiences in your career, school, work.
- Ask students what they like, what they want to do.
