Articulating the need locally

- In 2016-17, there were more racist than sectarian hate crimes in Northern Ireland;
- 83% did not result in prosecution or even a warning;
- 52% wouldn't accept an Irish Traveller as a close friend;
- 47% wouldn't accept a Muslim as a close friend;
- A third of 18-24 year olds won't even accept a Muslim as a neighbour in their local area.




Integrated Education

- Integrated schools aim to maintain a
 40:40:20 split in student enrolment.
- 7% of students in NI attend integrated schools.
- This drops to 5% at post-primary level.
- Neither of the two main political parties have expressed support for integrated education in the most recent election.







Islam is Northern Ireland's second largest faith. It has a growing and active community, particularly in south Belfast and is served by the Belfast Islamic Centre. We visited the centre and met with Naomi, Muhammad and Sheikh Anwar Mady to find out about Islam and the experiences of Muslims living in Northern Ireland.

Questions for discussion:

- All three contributors mentioned the negative perceptions of Islam in the media. How can we work together to educate the community about Islam?
- In his interview, Muhammad said that it is easier to be a Muslim man than a Muslim woman in Northern Ireland. What reasons can you think of for this? How can we counteract discrimination faced by the Muslim community?

- An essential aspect of Baha'i belief is service to others in the community. What impact do you think this has on integration? How might you serve your local community?
