PROJECT OVERVIEW AND AIMS:

- Students continue to lobby and work representatives regarding projects throughout the year which have budgets and are completely student led

- Non specialist teachers are feeling empowered and developing skills of student led learning and active Citizenship teaching techniques
- Students skills and confidence in debating and advocacy increasing, with a greater number participating in decision making across the school
- Students become accountable for project planning and running a budget
